VETERINARY CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF ASSISTANCE DOGS FOR COUNTRIES/REGIONS UNDER SCHEDULE I to III (4/4)

I COUNTRY /REGION OF EXPORT

<u>SCHEDULE I</u> – Australia, New Zealand, Ireland and United Kingdom (Great Britain and Northern Ireland) <u>SCHEDULE II</u> – Austria, Belgium, Bermuda, Canada, Cayman Islands, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong SAR, Iceland, Italy, Japan, Jersey, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, New Caledonia, Norway, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain (except Ceuta and Melilla), Sweden, Switzerland, the Netherlands, USA

SCHEDULE III - All countries other than those listed in Schedule I and II

II PURPOSE

As assistance dogs only.

III IMPORT LICENCE

Each animal shall be accompanied by a valid import licence issued by the National Parks Board/Animal & Veterinary Service (NParks/AVS).

IV ELIGIBILITY OF ASSISTANCE DOGS

The following documentation must be submitted to NParks/AVS for assessment for eligibility of the import as an assistance dog, prior to the import permit application.

For Schedule I - III countries/regions

- (a) supporting documentation from a medical practitioner OR documentation certified by a NParks/AVS approved organization in relation to the owner's disability and ongoing dependence on the assistance dog;
- (b) documentation providing confirmation of training of the assistance dog at a member organization of the International Guide Dog Federation (IGDF) or Assistance Dogs International (ADI);
- (c) supporting documentation that the assistance dog has been in assistance to the owner for at least 6 months prior to the scheduled date of importation OR official documentation from a recognized assistance dog training school or organization which states that the assistance dog has been at or under the supervision of the school for at least 6 months prior to the scheduled date of importation;

Additional requirements for Schedule II and III countries/regions

- (d) vaccination details and laboratory test reports of the assistance dog
- (e) **(For Schedule III countries/regions only)** NParks/AVS must be informed of where the assistance dog will be residing for the first 30 days while in Singapore

V VETERINARY CERTIFICATION

The animal shall be accompanied by:

- (a) a veterinary certificate (in accordance with the attached template) bearing a date not more than seven (7) days prior to export, signed by a *government approved veterinarian* of the country/region of export *and endorsed by an official government veterinarian of the country/region of export*, describing the age, breed, sex, colour, markings or other points of identification of assistance dog and certifying to the effect that:
 - (i) the assistance dog had been continuously resident in the country/region of export, or any country listed under Part I for at least six (6) months prior to export, or since birth.
 - (ii) the assistance dog was examined by the government approved veterinarian not more than seven (7) days prior to export and found to be healthy, free from any clinical sign of infectious or contagious disease and fit for travel.
 - (iii) the assistance dog was at least twelve (12) weeks of age at the time of export.
 - (iv) the assistance dog has been examined by the government approved veterinarian not more than seven (7) days prior to export and found to be implanted with a microchip that bears the identification code as that indicated in the veterinary health certificate and the vaccination certificate.

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- (v) (For Schedule II countries/regions) the assistance dog must have valid vaccination against rabies using an inactivated vaccine or recombinant vaccine acceptable to NParks/AVS prior to export. This refers to a valid vaccination according to the expiry date on the vaccination certificate and in accordance with the recommendations of the vaccine manufacturer. At least 28 days after the primary rabies vaccination or last rabies booster, the dog is subjected to a WOAH prescribed test showing a rabies neutralising antibody titre of at least 0.5 IU/mI, not less than 90 days and not more than 12 months prior to export. The rabies serology test must be conducted at either a WOAH reference laboratory for rabies or at a laboratory in a Schedule I or II country approved by the respective Competent Authority of the Schedule I or II country.
- (vi) (For Schedule III countries/regions) the assistance dog must have valid vaccination against rabies using an inactivated vaccine or recombinant vaccine acceptable to NParks/AVS. This refers to a valid primary vaccination and/or up to date booster(s) in accordance with the recommendations of the vaccine manufacturer. At least 28 days after the primary rabies vaccination or rabies booster, the dog is subjected to a WOAH prescribed test showing a rabies neutralising antibody titre of at least 0.5 IU/ml, not less than 90 days and not more than 12 months prior to export. The rabies serology test must be conducted at either a WOAH Reference Laboratory for rabies or at a laboratory in a Schedule I or II country approved by the respective Competent Authority of the Schedule I or II country.
- (ii) the assistance dog was vaccinated according to the vaccine manufacturer's recommendations and not less than two (2) weeks prior to export against Canine Distemper virus, Canine Adenovirus type 1 and Canine Parvovirus type 2.
- (vii) The assistance dog has been treated with a product effective against external parasites (fleas and ticks) between 2 and 7 days of export (state active ingredient and date of treatment), and with a product effective against internal parasites (nematodes and cestodes) between 2 and 7 days of export (state active ingredient and date of treatment).
- (b) the assistance dog's original vaccination certificate, which also bears the identification code of the microchip that has been implanted. The vaccination certificate also bears the details (name of veterinarian, name and address of veterinary practice) and endorsement of government-approved veterinarian who vaccinated the dog and verified the microchip identification code.

VI DECLARATION FROM MASTER/CAPTAIN OF SHIP/AIRCRAFT

The animal shall be accompanied by a signed declaration from the master/captain of the ship/aircraft in which the animal was carried stating:

- (a) that the assistance dog had been embarked or emplaned in the country/region of export and had not been landed at any intermediate port (unless approved by NParks/AVS) during the voyage/flight to Singapore
- (b) that no dog from any other country was permitted aboard or carried in the ship or aircraft during the time that the assistance dog to which the declaration refers was on board the ship or aircraft,

VII QUARANTINE

No quarantine if all the veterinary regulations are complied with and the animals are clinically healthy on arrival.

VIII APPLICATION FOR IMPORT LICENCE

(i) The owner or his agent must apply for the import licence by submitting an online application through GoBusiness Licensing Portal (https://www.gobusiness.gov.sg/licences) prior to the arrival of animals.

(ii) Multiple Import/Export Licence:

- Owners that travel frequently with their assistance dogs may apply to NParks/AVS for a multiple import/export licence prior to travel. The licence will be valid till the expiry date of the assistance dog's rabies vaccination or 1 year from the date of issuance, whichever is earlier.
- The owner must arrange for the inspection <u>at least 5 days</u> before the requested time of inspection. Otherwise, the inspection will be chargeable. The assistance dog must be presented, along with the original documents, for all import and export inspections.

(iii) Assistance dogs returning to Singapore within 7 days of export:

For assistance dogs returning to Singapore within 7 days of export, where the owner is unable to
obtain a government endorsed health certificate from the exporting country, the dog will be inspected
within 48 hours of departure from Singapore and on arrival in Singapore by an NParks/AVS officer.

- The NParks/AVS officer will endorse the export and import licences at the time of inspection. The export licence must be shown at the time of import to verify the duration of time spent overseas.
- The owner must arrange for the NParks/AVS inspection <u>at least 5 days</u> before the requested time of inspection. Otherwise, the inspection will be chargeable. The assistance dog must be presented, along with the original documents, for both inspections.
- (Assistance dogs returning to Singapore by ship) For assistance dogs returning to Singapore by ship, where the owner is unable to obtain a government endorsed health certificate not more than 7 days prior to import into Singapore, a health certificate must be obtained from the last port of boarding and the assistance dog must be accompanied by a captain's declaration (format attached as Annex C), stating that the assistance dog did not disembark or come into contact with any other dogs during the entire duration of travel.

IX NOTIFICATION OF ARRIVAL

The owner or his agent shall contact the Quarantine Office as stated in the Import Licence at least five (5) working days before the arrival of the animal.

X VÉTERINARY INSPECTION

On arrival at the port of disembarkation in Singapore, the assistance dog and documents (Import Licence, Veterinary Health Certificate) shall be presented to and examined by an authorised Veterinary Officer. If the animal is found to be healthy and documents are in order, the animal shall be released to the owner or his agent.

XI PENALTY

All imports must comply fully with the conditions of the Import Licence and Veterinary Conditions, unless prior written approval has been obtained from NParks/AVS. Any consignment of animals or related products that do not meet the requirements may be detained, returned to the country/region of export or destroyed at the discretion of the Director-General, Animal Health and Welfare. In addition, the importer shall be guilty of an offence under the Animals and Birds Act Section 8(1) and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$10,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or to both.

XII FEES

- (i) Import Licence/Export Permit Fees and NParks/AVS inspection fees waived (except otherwise indicated)
- (ii) Accommodation fee at Changi Animal & Plant Quarantine Unit } see Fee Schedule:

- (iv) Other fees and charges, eg. NParks/AVS laboratory testing charges for tests as required by the importing country, are chargeable

XIII OTHER REQUIREMENTS/INFORMATION

(i) Owners should take into account the age and condition of their animals as well as travel and climatic stress when deciding to export their assistance dogs to Singapore.

BREED RESTRICTIONS

(ii) The following breeds of dogs and their crosses are not allowed to be imported into Singapore - Pit Bull (which includes the American Pit Bull Terrier also known as the American Pit Bull and Pit Bull Terrier, American Staffordshire Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier, the American Bulldog, and crosses between them and with other breeds) Neapolitan Mastiff, Tosa, Akita, Dogo Argentino, Boerboel, Fila Brasileiro, Perro de Presa Canario and their crosses.

MICROCHIP

(iii) The microchip that is implanted into the dog must meet with ISO (International Standards Organisation) Standard 11784 or Annex A to ISO Standard 11785. If the dog is implanted with a microchip which does not comply with these stated ISO Standards, the owner of the dog or his authorised agent must provide a reader which is able to read the identification code of the implanted microchip at the point of entry into Singapore.

TRANSPORTATION

- (iv) (If containers are used) Owners must ensure that the animal has been transported in escape-proof containers conforming to the latest International Air Transport Association's (IATA) Live Animal Regulations.
- (v) Owners should ensure to the best of their ability that the animal is not pregnant at the time of export. Should the animal whelp in quarantine, the owner must ensure that adequate quarantine facilities and veterinary care are available for the well-being of the newborn animals. The owner must bear any additional costs as a result of such an event.

OTHER LICENCES

- (vi) Owners of any dog above 3 months of age must apply for a licence to keep the dog in Singapore. See Fee Schedule: Attachment-1.
- (vii) Owners should be aware of the conditions of licence for dogs available through NParks/AVS website (https://pals.avs.gov.sg), which is not limited to but includes the following requirements:
 - A maximum of 3 dogs may be kept in private premises.
 - Only one (1) dog of an approved breed is allowed in a HDB residential unit.
 - The following breeds of dogs must comply with additional conditions listed below Bull Terrier, Doberman Pinscher, Rottweiler, German Shepherd Dog with its related breeds such as the Belgian Shepherd Dog and the East European Shepherd Dog, Mastiffs including the Bull Mastiff, Cane Corso and Dogue De Bordeaux, and crosses between any of the above breeds and other breeds:

- a. Only one (1) dog from the above breeds is permitted to be kept in a premise.
- b. The dog must be leashed and securely muzzled when in a public place.
- c. Owners must take up an insurance policy for at least \$100,000 and a banker's guarantee for \$2,000.
- (viii) A licence must be obtained from NParks/AVS to use any place for exhibition, sale or export of any animal or bird.

OTHERS

- (ix) Any expenditure incurred in the process of importation shall be borne by the owner or agent. Any loss occasioned during the removal, handling or treatment of an imported dog under the directions of NParks/AVS or occurring during the period of detention in quarantine, shall be borne by the owner or agent.
- (x) If the animal dies or is destroyed while under the custody of NParks/AVS, NParks/AVS will not be liable for any compensation.
- (xi) Regulations and fees are subject to change without notice notwithstanding the issuance of a licence by NParks/AVS.
- (xii) To avoid documentation problems on arrival, copies of all required documentation other than NParks/AVS import licence should be scanned and sent via e-mail to animal_feedback@nparks.gov.sg at least 5 days before import. Original documents must accompany the assistance dog upon arrival.
- (xiii) The owner or his/her agent must make all necessary arrangements for the import/ export of the dog into Singapore.
- (xiv) The owner of the assistance dog may be subject to prosecution for breach or failure to comply with any of the Veterinary Conditions.
- (xv) NParks/AVS reserves the right to impose any additional requirements and conditions as deemed necessary.
- (xvi) For imports from Schedule III countries, the owner of the assistance dog must sign a declaration upon import stating that:
 - (a) The dog will be used only as an assistance dog to the owner and not for any other purpose;
 - (b) No other mammalian animals will be kept resident at the declared residential premises of the dog during the 30 days following import;
 - (c) The assistance dog will be under his/her control at all times;
 - (d) Contact between the assistance dog with other animals will be avoided as far as possible when it is outside the premises of the declared residential address
 - (e) The owner will notify NParks/AVS immediately if the dog should come into contact with any other animal, be involved in any dog bite incident, or show clinical signs of illness in the 30 days following import;
 - (f) The owner will seek approval from NParks/AVS before seeking any treatment for the assistance dog at a veterinary clinic.
 - (g) The owner will allow NParks/AVS officers to inspect the assistance dog and carry out any tests or treatment on the dog where deemed necessary by NParks/AVS.
- (xvii) For more information regarding import inspection and clearance at Changi Animal and Plant Quarantine (CAPQ), please refer to our <u>website</u>.

Please note:

Section 72 of the Animals and Birds Act states that:

"(1) Any action taken under the provisions of this Act or of any rule, order or direction made or given thereunder in respect of any animal, bird, carcase, article, building or conveyance shall be at the risk of the owner thereof.

(2) No liability shall attach to the Board or to any officer thereof in respect of any expense, loss, damage or delay arising in or from the lawful exercise of the powers under this Act.

Section 78 of the Animals and Birds Act states that:

"No suit or other legal proceedings shall lie against the Board, the Director-General or any authorised officer, police officer, officer of customs or any other person acting under the direction of the Board or Director-General for anything which is in good faith done in the execution or purported execution of this Act."
