

Plants Shaping the Region and Beyond


Throughout history, human civilisation has valued and depended on plants for many different purposes. Find out what these important plants are and draw your discoveries below.

- Changed the daily life of the local people






An Important Dictionary






The Botanical Orchestra

Many of these instruments are made from plant materials and produce beautiful music. Can you find the names of these instruments?



They produce of the world's oxygen.






MAP OF THE ETHNOBOTANY GARDEN






Plants in Creative Expression


