



It also serves as a knowledge centre for plants and gardening by providing greening ideas and solutions through showcase gardens, and offering a platform for the horticulture and landscape industry to share best practices, products and services.

HortPark is part of the Southern Ridges that comprises other parks such as Mount Faber Park, Telok Blangah Hill Park, Kent Ridge Park and Labrador Nature Park. Popular with gardening enthusiasts, families, and community groups who yearn for a tranquil environment in which to relax, it is also frequently visited by nature lovers who enjoy walks along the Southern Ridges.

Built in the early 20th century, this colonial bungalow was designed in the Arts and Crafts style, with its steeply-pitched tile roof and gable wall. Closely tied to Singapore's rail history, this building was gazetted for conservation in 2014, and restored in 2017 as the Centre for Urban Greenery and Ecology (CUGE).



Floral Walk

Floral Walk is the welcoming gateway that leads visitors into HortPark. It is a tropical cut flower garden which features a range of heliconia, ginger and banana plants that produce flamboyant flowers, and filler plants with ornamental foliage often used for flower arrangements.



Vertical Greenery

These vertical gardens provide a green solution to enhance any building facade. They also offer thermal insulation for buildings. Plants grown on the vertical gardens filter the air and provide habitats for urban wildlife.



My Backyard Kitchen

A 'backyard kitchen' is based on the idea of a backyard garden being the extension of a kitchen, by providing ingredients for food and beverages. It can be located anywhere – a plot at the back of one's house, along corridors, or even in balconies. This series of gardens showcases edibles that can be used for teatime snacks, desserts and beverages.



Budding gardeners can pick up practical gardening know-how, or simply be inspired by the various themed gardens to design and start their own gardens!



Espalier Garden

The art of espalier (the growing of plants against a flat surface or structure) produces attractive designs. Espalier plants bear fruits in larger volumes than usual, and the fruits are within easy reach. Learn how to start growing your own espaliers!



SG50 Community in Bloom Gardens

Launched at the Community Garden Festival in 2015, the SG50 Community in Bloom Gardens celebrate Singapore's Golden Jubilee. The celebratory gardens revolve around the themes of 'People & Plants', 'People & Spaces', and 'People & Landscapes'.



Pitter Patter Potter Garden

Mirrored after the primary school's social and natural science curricula, it features a 'Classroom in a Garden' suitable for learning about seed dispersal methods and concepts such as recycling.



Native Garden

This garden is populated with plant species that are native to Singapore. It also features an extended area where native plants are categorised based on how they are used – as medicine, food, timber or to enhance habitats for birds and butterflies.



Edible Garden

Take in the sights and smells of common and exotic edible plants in the Edible Garden. Comprising fruit and vegetable plots, it demonstrates that edible gardens can be functional, educational and attractive.



Allotment Garden

The Allotment Garden comprises $2.5 \text{ m} \times 1 \text{ m}$ raised planter beds rented out to members of the public who wish to nurture their green fingers. Equipped with built-in storage and nearby water points, each plot can be leased for three years.



Therapeutic Garden

Come relax and unwind at the Therapeutic
Garden. Designed using the principles of
horticultural therapy, this well-shaded garden uses
attractive colours, interesting textures and sounds
of nature to intrigue and invigorate visitors.



Butterfly Garden

This garden is planted with suitable nectar and host plants for breeding a variety of butterflies, including those deemed to be vulnerable. Visitors can also learn about the importance of butterflies in our local ecosystem.



Nature Playgarden

Designed with pre-schoolers in mind and built with natural materials, the Nature Playgarden encourages children to spend more time outdoors and reconnect with nature. Let them explore the nine different play features while enjoying the breeze and leaves rustling in the wind.
